1 STEP 1

The admission test for MBA, M.Phil. and MS programmes comprises two main components: English and General Knowledge: 30% Mathematics/Biology and Subject Knowledge: 70% This structure evaluates both general aptitude and discipline-specific knowledge to ensure candidates meet the required academic standards.

2 STEP 2

After the announcement of pre-admission test results, a comprehensive preliminary merit list is displayed on the SBBU website. Candidates shortlisted based on merit may be invited for an interview, particularly for Master's programmes, before the Admission Committee.

3 STEP 3


All eligible candidates applying for various disciplines are required to appear in a computer-based pre-admission test as part of the selection process. The test serves as a qualifying criterion for admission and ensures transparency and merit.

4 STEP 4

Candidates are required to bring original documents for verification during the interview. The following original documents may be temporarily retained by the university until verification from relevant boards or universities: Original Graduation/Master's/Last Qualification Certificate or Marksheet (for BS Bridge). Marksheet of SSC (Matriculation). Marksheet of HSC (Intermediate) – Original required for BS Programme. Domicile of candidate/guardian. PRC and C-Form of candidate. CNIC or B-Form. NOC (for departmental or out-of-province candidates, if required).

Disciplinary Policies

- 1.** Discipline among the students of the university/ campuses shall be enforced & maintained by the authority, Registrar, Directors, HoDs and relevant officers.
- 2.** The Authority shall supervise and control the discipline through the following officers:
 - a. In the University Teaching Departments through the Chairman / Chairpersons / Head of the Teaching Departments, Deans, Directors and Registrar.
 - b. In the campus through the HoDs / Directors of the campus concerned and Registrar.
 - c. In Hostels through the Warden and Provost.
 - d. In colleges/post-graduate centers through the principals concerned and Director Colleges and Inspector of Colleges.
- 3.** If the following, among others, acts are committed related to in-discipline, action shall be taken against the student / students by the officers relevant mentioned under clauses:
 - a. Breach of any rule of public morals, such as.
 - i. Use of indecent or uncivilized language and act.
 - ii. Use of immodest dress.
 - iii. Use of undesirable remarks or gestures.
 - iv. Disorderly behavior, such as shouting abusing, quarrelling, fighting & insolence.
 - v. Carrying, using or threatening with firearms and deadly weapons.
 - b. Defiance of authority.
 - c. False presentation or giving false information about anyone on social media or willful suppression of

- information, cheating or deceiving.
- d. Visiting the place declared "Out of Bounds" / restricted.
 - e. Visiting, without pass, places which are not to be visited without a pass if any.
 - f. Inciting or staging a walkout, a strike or an unauthorized procession. (Blocking of gates, roads etc.).
 - g. Shouting of slogans derogatory to the prestige of the University or the reputation of its officers and teachers.
 - h. Being found under the effect of an intoxicant.
 - i. Immorality.
 - j. Action defamatory of and derogatory to Islam, Pakistan or University.
 - k. Abetting use of unfair means at an Examination.
 - l. Indulging in activities prejudicial and detrimental to good order on the campus.
 - m. Unauthorized use of or damaging University's moveable or immovable property.
 - n. All such other activities, which the authority may consider as a breach of discipline.
- 4.** Punishment or penalty for any of the offence mentioned in the above clauses shall be according to the gravity of the case and may be applied one or more offences of the following.
- a. A record in the Black Book maintained by the Student Advisor or any authorized officer.
 - b. Fine, which may amount to Rs. 5000/- or more (estimation of damage caused).
 - c. Expulsion from the class, hostels for a specified period; Detention from Examination.
 - d. Cancellation of Examination results or withdrawal of certificate granted.
 - e. Expulsion or rustication from the University.



Disciplinary Policies

5. To impose punishment or penalty shall be exercised by the officers to the extent given below:
 - a. The officers (HoDs / Registrar / Deans / Directors / Principals) with the approval of authority may:
 - i. *Fine a student up to Rs.5000 - 100000 / or more for each single offence and deprive him /her of privileges and positions open to students.*
 - ii. *Detain a student from the University Examination.*
 - iii. *Cancel the admission of a student or refuse to admit a student without giving any reason.*
 - iv. University reserves right to de-activate attendance portal of any student involved in unwanted activity/ fee defaulter and his/ her entrance in the university may be get banned.
 - b. The Warden, student's advisor or Provost with the approval of authority may:
 - I. *Fine a student up to Rs. 50000/- for each single offence.*
 - II. *Expel a student from the University Hostel/Campus for the maximum period of two or more semesters.*
 - III. *Withhold good character certificate to a student.*
 - iv. The Students Advisor or any authorized officer shall maintain a character role of all students of the University.
7. The certificate/degree/diploma and other documents of a student involved in case of breach of discipline may be withheld till the final disposal of the case.
8. The students will not be transferred from it's sub campuses to main campus because of different merit criteria of each campus.
9. During the academic hours the student card is mandatory and in any emergency girls' students shall have to get gate pass from HoD concerned to leave the university. In case of hostler (Girls), the gate pass is mandatory to leave the premises of the University, without gate pass the disciplinary action may be taken.



10 Medical Leave Policy

a Eligibility for Medical Leave

Medical leave may be granted to students who are unable to attend classes due serious illness, injury, or medical conditions that require hospitalization or long-term treatment.

The student must provide a valid medical certificate from a recognized medical practitioner or hospital.

b Duration of Medical Leave

Short-Term Medical Leave:

For illnesses or medical conditions requiring absence of up to two weeks.

Long-Term Medical Leave:

For serious medical conditions (i.e. pregnancy, chronic disease, major injury etc.) requiring absence exceeding two weeks

c Application Procedure

Submission:

Students are required to submit a medical leave application to the department's administrative office, signed by the relevant Head of Department (HoD) and Dean, within 48 hours of the onset of illness, where feasible. However, applications for both short-term and long-term medical leave will not be accepted after the mid-term examination.

Documentation

The application must include:

- A completed medical leave form.
- A medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner detailing the diagnosis, duration of the illness, and the required period of leave.



Rules & Regulations

- Verification: The university reserves the right to verify the authenticity of the medical certificate and may refer the case to the university's medical officer if necessary.

c Approval Process

Short-Term Leave:

The academic committee comprises of Dean, relevant HoD and Additional Registrar (Academics) can approve short-term medical leave up to weeks only.

Long-Term Leave:

Long-term medical leave (beyond two weeks) requires approval from the university's medical board and the academic committee. For long-term leave, the student may need to withdraw from the semester or freeze their studies (see semester freeze policy), depending on the severity and duration of the illness.

d Impact on Academic Standing

Attendance Requirement:

Students granted short-term medical leave will be exempt from attendance requirements during the leave period.

Make-up Work:

Students on short-term leave are responsible for coordinating with their subject teachers to complete any missed assignments, quizzes, or other academic work within a reasonable timeframe after their return. However, if a student misses the mid-term examinations due to short-term leave, there will be no opportunity to retake the missed mid-term exams at a later date.

For students on long-term medical leave, the university may allow a break from studies for the entire semester. Students availing long-term medical leave may be required to withdraw from their courses if the

leave substantially hinders their ability to meet course requirements. In such cases, students may be allowed to repeat the semester and continue their degree programme with the subsequent junior class.

11 Medical Leave Policy:

e Extension of Medical Leave

If a student's medical condition extends beyond the initially approved period, they must submit a new application with updated medical documentation. The extension request should be submitted before the expiration of the current leave.

12 Semester Freeze Policy for Undergraduate Students

Undergraduate students are allowed to freeze their academic studies for a maximum of one year during their four-year degree program.

a Application Submission:

The application for freezing must be submitted through the proper channels, with valid justification (medical or other significant reasons) prior to the commencement of the mid-term exams.

b Approval Process:

The Additional Registrar (Academics) will review the application and issue a formal confirmation letter regarding the semester freeze.

c Approval Process:

The freeze period is limited to one academic year. For instance, if a student freezes during the 3rd semester, they will rejoin the 3rd semester with the new batch when the programme resumes.

Any student misses midterm examination won't be allowed to attempt 100 marks paper in final semester. He/ She has to attempt 70 marks paper only.



- 1** Students are strictly prohibited in:
 - a** Engaging in any immoral or agitational and violent activities or creating nuisance or disturbing the peace and tranquility on the campus.
 - b** Keeping electric appliances such as refrigerators/ air conditioners T.V., oven, burners and heaters etc.
 - c** Keeping and using medicines or other intoxicants except drugs prescribed by authorized medical expert on account of illness.
 - d** Keeping unauthorized persons in the room.
 - e** Subletting the allotted room or any other room lying vacant.
 - f** Nonpayment of Hostel dues during the quarter of the year for which allotment was given in the Hostel
 - g** Parking cars or other vehicles in places other than the designated parking lot. Inviting visitors in the Hostel rooms.
 - h** Causing willful damage or causing damage, acts of vandalism, removing or damaging Hostel University property.
 - i** Barricading stairs, corridors, gates, and other areas in the Hostel.
 - j** Staging sit-in, Lockup, occupying Hostel/ warden / administration offices.
 - k** Hostel fee will be charged annually.
 - l** Pasting of posters / chalking on Hostels / campus buildings / premises/ compound-walls or any portion thereof.
 - m** Inciting parochial, linguistic, sectarian / religious / feelings among Hostel residents.
 - n** Staying away from the Hostel premises after 10.00 pm for boys, 09:00 pm for girls and before call for Fajar prayer or for longer periods without prior permission from higher authorities. (Applies to boys / girls hostel only).



1 Students are Strictly Prohibited In:

- a Late comers or early deportees would be required to sign in a register at the Reception, stating valid reasons for late coming or early departure.
- b The Hostel authorities reserve the right to search the personal belongings and baggage of residents at the time of entering the Hostel or while residing in the allotted room
- c Cooking in the Hostel rooms is strictly prohibited.
- d No visitor shall be allowed to meet the residents of Hostels before 7:00a.m. and after 8:00p.m. Parents shall have to provide CNIC and record his/her name and address and signature and time of arrival and departure in the register kept at reception.
- e In any emergency or departing from hostel, hostler shall have to get gate pass from hostel warden.



1 Short Title

These regulations may be called the “SBBU, SBA, Conduct of Examinations Regulation, framed under clause (5) of SBBU, SBA Act (Amended) 2011”. These Rules shall come into force with immediate effect and shall be applicable to all students of the University.

2 Commencement:

These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force with immediate effect.

3 Definitions:

In these regulations, unless expressly stated otherwise;

- a “University” means the SBBU, SBA.
- b “Syndicate” means the syndicate of the university.
- c “Vice Chancellor” means Vice Chancellor of the university.
- d “Dean” means the Dean of the concerned faculty of the university.
- e “Controller of Examinations” means the Controller of Examinations of the university.
- f “Principal” means Head of college/institute affiliated to the university.
- g “Chairman” means Chairman of a teaching department of the university.
- h “Director” means Director of colleges, Director of Postgraduate studies of the university.
- i “Teacher” means, any Lecturer, Assistant Professor, Associate Professor or Professor teaching a subject/course in the university or institute or affiliated college to the university
- j “Discipline Committee” means discipline committee of the university constituted under the 1st statutes appended to SBBU, SBA Act-2013 or constituted separately with the approval of the Vice Chancellor.
- k “Unfair means Control Committee” means the committee appointed by the Vice Chancellor to scrutinize the reported cases of unfair means/malpractice of the university and affiliated colleges/institutes for recommendation to the discipline committee/Vice Chancellor.



- l** “Vigilance/Inspection committee” means the vigilance/inspection committee which may be constituted by the Vice Chancellor for monitoring overall conduct of examinations of the university and affiliated colleges/institutes.
- m** “Head Invigilator” means the concerned Dean of the monitoring of examinations of the university.
- n** “External/Internal Head Invigilator” means the teacher of the university (at least Associate Professor) Principal of the affiliated college/instituted appointed by the Vice Chancellor as External/Internal Head Invigilator on the recommendations of the concerned Dean for supervising overall conduct of examinations Regular/Failure examinations of the affiliated colleges/institutes.
- o** “External/Internal Head Invigilator” means the teacher of the university (at least Associate Professor) Principal of the affiliated college/instituted appointed by the Vice Chancellor as External/Internal Head Invigilator on the recommendations of the concerned Dean for supervising overall conduct of examinations Regular/Failure examinations of the affiliated colleges/institutes.
- p** “Invigilator” means any teacher/instructor appointed by the concerned factotum for conduct of Regular/Failure examinations of the concerned institute/department. In case of affiliated colleges/institutes, the external invigilators from amongst the teachers of the university or any other affiliated college/institute may be appointed by the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of concerned Director / Chairman / Principal.
- q** “Tabulator/Checker” means the teacher / officer / instructor of the university possessing good experience and understanding of examinations systems appointed by the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the Controller of Examinations for compilation and scrutiny or results of candidates of the university and affiliated colleges/institutes.
- r** Time Bar: Its maximum time period allowed to complete BS/ Masters / PhD.

The course for the social and basic science programmes will consist of 60-65% of curriculum towards the discipline specific areas of concentration as required by accreditation body non engineering courses will be of 30-35%

The course for Technology programmes discipline will consist of 65-70% of curriculum towards the discipline's specific areas and 35-40% minor /elective

9 Summer / Make-Up Semester for 2026 Batch & Onwards

a Duration:

An optional, intensive 08-week semester designed to accommodate academic recovery and performance improvement

b Eligibility Criteria:

Open to students who, have failed a course, were rendered ineligible for final examinations due to insufficient attendance, or wish to improve their course grades.

c Credit Hour Load:

Students may enroll in a maximum of 09 credit hours during the Summer Semester. In exceptional cases, subject to departmental recommendation and approval, registration may be extended up to 10 credit hours.

d Instructional Contact Hours:

To ensure comprehensive coverage of course content within the condensed timeline, weekly contact hours shall be doubled in accordance with HEC guidelines and international academic standards.

e Policy Alignment:

All academic rules and regulations applicable to the Fall and Spring semesters shall be equally enforced during the Summer Semester, ensuring consistency and academic integrity.

f Examination Policy:

No supplementary or special examinations shall be offered to students of Batch-26 and onward during the Summer Semester.



g Course Offering Requirements:

A minimum enrollment of five (05) students per course shall be required for the course to be offered in the Summer Semester.

h Fee Structure:

A nominal fee of PKR 5,000 per course shall be charged to students registering for the Summer Semester, applicable to both repeat and grade improvement cases.

9 Summer / Make-Up Semester for 2026 Batch & Onwards

i Faculty Remuneration Structure:

Compensation for faculty members teaching in the Summer Semester shall be as follows:

- Theory Course (3 Credit Hours): PKR 25,000
- Theory Course (2 Credit Hours): PKR 15,000
- Laboratory Course: PKR 10,000 (inclusive of distribution: Lab Technician – PKR 2,000; Lab Attendant – PKR 1,000)

Note: The stated remuneration covers all associated responsibilities including course delivery, assessments, paper setting, grading, and examination administration.

The adoption of this Summer Semester policy is anticipated to enhance academic flexibility, reduce student backlog, and foster timely graduation rates while maintaining academic rigor and quality assurance.



10 Destruction / Disposal of Exam Materials

The following policy for destruction of Question Papers/Answer Books/result sheet of all types of University examinations will be adopted.

- a If a student gets 'F' grade, s/he will be required to repeat or improve the course or its recommended alternative, if any. However, "F" grade obtained earlier will also be recorded on the transcript.
- b Question paper, if not part of the answer book, will be disposed off after the conduct of the examination.
- c Midterm Semester absent will not allow 100 marks paper.
- d Soft and hard copies of the awards received from the concerned subject teacher will be retained permanently in separate and secure locations.

13 Late Admission and Course Assessment

In case a student joins a course after it has started, s/he will be responsible for any missed quizzes, assignments and lectures. The marks in missed quizzes etc will be considered zero while make-up tests, assignments, projects and labs can be arranged in consultation with the teacher/Head of Department. There will be no Supplementary/ Special Examination in a Semester System; if a student fails in a course, He/she shall have to wait and appear in the final semester examination with preceding batch when it is announced.

14 Fractionalized Grading Policy

Keeping in view the variations related to both academic systems (Semester System), the following equivalence of GPA/CGPA and percentage is recommended for adoption:

- a The grading/marking system in the university will be the Absolute Grading System. Nevertheless, teachers are encouraged to adopt the Relative Grading System as suggested by HEC.
- b To implement the semester system effectively, the subject teacher must display his/her provisional result within five days after the conduct of the final exam of that subject and submit the same to the controller of examination for the final announcement.

14 Computation of Semester Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

a Quality Point (Q.P.)

For the computation of the (G.P.A.), the quality point (Q.P.) is first determined by multiplying the value of the grade point (G.P.) earned by the students with the Credit Hours of that course, e.g., if a student obtains a “B+” grade for a three credit hours course then this Q.P. will be calculated as follows:

$$(Q.P.) = 3.2 \times 3 = 9.60$$

b Grade Point Average (G.P.A.)

Grade point average is an expression of the average performance of a student in the courses he/she has offered during a particular semester. This is calculated by adding the quality points of all the courses taken, divided by the total number of Credit hours offered:

$$(G.P.A.) = \text{Sum of Quality Points} / \text{Sum of the Credit Hours}$$

c Cumulative Grade Point Average (C.G.P.A.)

The Cumulative Grade Point Average (C.G.P.A.) is the expression describing the performance of a student in all semesters and is determined in the following way:

$$(C.G.P.A.) = \text{Sum of Quality Points of all the courses appeared} / \text{Sum of the Credit Hours for all the courses appeared}$$

16 CGPA Required for the Completion of Undergraduate and Graduate Degree

- For completion of the degree, the minimum qualifying CGPAs for BS and MS/MPhil Students are 2.00 and 2.50, respectively.
- In case a student secures less than 2.00 CGPA (minimum qualifying CGPA) at the end of final Semester/s, he/she may be allowed to get re-admission in one or more courses, in which his/her Grade is below C, along with the forthcoming semester, provided that s/he is not debarred under the CGPA Improvement Regulation and time duration specified for the program.

17 Rules For Promotion

- The promotion from the first semester to the second, or from the third to the fourth or from the fifth to the sixth semester will be automatic; however, the student must meet the minimum requirement of attendance in that semester.



- b** For the promotion from the second semester to the third semester, a student must have (i) minimum attendance and (ii) a G.P.A. of 2.00 or above, in the preceding two semesters.
- c** If a student secures less than 2.00 C.G.P.A. in the preceding two semesters, the promotion (from second to third, and fourth) will be promoted to the next semester (3rd/5th conditionally), i.e., they will be treated on probation, and he/she must enroll in summer semester to improve the grade. if they fail to maintain the required CGPA in summer semester their admission will be cancelled.
- d** Those students whose admission is cancelled due to the above reason will not be allowed to enroll in any class for at least one semester.

18 Rules For Promotion For LLB Programmes

- a** The academic year is divided into two semesters, each spanning 18 weeks.
- b** A first semester examination is conducted at the end of the first semester, but students are required to pass the final year-end examination for promotion to the next year.
- c** The subjects for the LL. B Second Semester are distinct from those covered in the first semester.

d Assessment Procedure:

Division System:

The Law Department operates a division system, categorizing students into two divisions based on their performance:

- 1st Division: Awarded to students achieving 60% or more marks.
- 2nd Division: Awarded to students scoring below 60%.

Pass Percentage: The passing percentage is 40% in individual papers and 50% in aggregate.



19 Associate Degree (AD)

An Associate Degree (AD) is a two-year post-higher-secondary school certificate (HSSC) academic degree offered by the universities primarily in market-driven subjects based on local and regional community and industry needs. An Associate Degree programme is structured to be comprised of four regular semesters over a period of two years and consists of 60-72 credit hours. The AD qualification holder can get admission in the fifth semester of a relevant undergraduate degree program.

20 Duration of Bachelor (Undergraduate) Programmes

The Graduate (Bachelor) programmes, in Faculty of Science & Technology (FST), Faculty of Social Sciences (FSS) Faculty of Computing, as well as Faculty of Management & Business Administration (FMBA) are of four years (8-Semester) duration maximum 6 years, after successful completion of Higher Secondary Certificate or equivalent examination.

21 Duration of Masters (Graduate) Programmes

The duration of master degree programmes offered after 4 years BS Bachelor degree programme is minimum 02 years and maximum 04 years.

22 Course Weightage - Credit Hour

Each course carries certain credit hours assigned to it. One credit hour (CH) for a particular course is generally to be considered as 01 hour (one period) of teaching per week. The number of CH indicates weightage of the course compared to other courses and also reflects number of hours of teaching of that course per week. Thus a course of 3 CH would mean a total of $3 \times 16 = 48$ (credit hours assigned to the course multiplied by the number of weeks of semester) hours of actual teaching of the course in a semester. Laboratory Course (Practical) up to 03 hours duration conducted weekly, is assigned 1 CH.



23 Attendance Requirement

- a** Any Student having below than 75% attendance in lecture and practical will not be allowed for the Examination(s).
- b** Concerned course teacher is directed to maintain the date wise online attendance regularly without delay.
- c** Online attendance through Student Attendance Management System (SAMS) would be used for attendance record and number of lectures are to be presented by concerned teacher.
- d** The relevant HoD and the Dean will have an access of online attendance record by the faculty.
- e** Shortage of the student's attendance is intimated to the students on time.
- f** Late attendance of the student may be considered as 1/2 absent.

24 Award of Final Degree Certificate

A student can be awarded a degree certificate of his/her discipline in which he/she has got admission if his/her overall minimum CGPAs for BS, BBA, MBA and MS/M.Phil secured 2.0 and 2.5 respectively.



25 Indiscipline in Examinations

Any candidate found guilty of following matters, his/her case will be submitted to Unfair Means Cases Committee constituted by the University. This committee will be comprised of Senior Dean as Convener and the concerned Dean and the Chairman as members.

- a Removes a leaf from his/her answer book, the answer book shall be marked as invalid/cancelled. Submits forged or fake documents in connection with the examination.
- b Commits impersonation in the examination. Copies from any paper, book or notes.
- c Mutilates the answer book.
- d Possesses any kind of material, which may be helpful to him/her in the examination
- e Commits anything that is immoral or illegal in connection with the examination and which may be helpful to him/her in the examination
- f Refuses to obey the invigilation staff or refuses to follow the instructions issued by the University in connection with the examination.
- g Misbehaves or creates any kind of disturbance in or around the examination center
- h Uses abusive or inappropriate language on the answer script.
- i Possesses any kind of weapon in or around examination center.
- j Possesses any kind of electronic device which may be helpful in the examination

26 Unfair Means / Malpractices

Any student found using unfair means or assisting another student during a test/examination or copying from another student would be liable to disciplinary action. A student found guilty of such act by the Unfair Means Committee, will be dealt with in the light of policy in vogue.



27 His / Her Case Shall Result in Penalties Keeping in View the Nature and Intensity of Offence, as Under

- a Cancellation of paper Unfair Means Cases Committee will decide whether the student will have to appear in summer semester/with regular semester for the cancelled paper.
- b Suspension from programme for one semester.
- c Imposition of Heavy or light Fine Expulsion from the University forever.
- d Any other action deemed appropriate.

28 Secrecy and Security Protocols Policy

Purpose

To ensure secure and confidential handling of examination materials and processes and to preserve the university's academic integrity and preventing unauthorized access, leakage, or tampering. The secrecy officer, department of examination shall be responsible for maintain overall secrecy. confidentiality of the examination process till declaration of results.

Key Responsibilities of the Secrecy Officer

- a Appointing secrecy cell personnel with the recommendation of Controller of Examinations duly approval of competent authority.
- b Receiving, coding, and securing question papers from paper setters.
- c Supervising secure printing and packing of exam papers.
- d Ensuring safe transport and delivery of papers to examination centers.
- e Securing award lists and transcripts from tampering or early disclosure.
